

PROPOSED MINUTES
LEGISLATIVE COORDINATING COUNCIL
January 8, 2026

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Dan Hawkins at 1:30 p.m., Thursday, January 8, 2026, in Room 548-S, Statehouse.

1. Chairperson Hawkins presented the minutes for the meeting of the Legislative Coordinating Council held on December 22, 2025, for consideration and approval. Chairperson Hawkins recognized Gordon Self, Revisor of Statutes, who stated that a revision was required for the signature line of such minutes. Vice Chairperson Ty Masterson moved that the presented minutes be revised and approved. The motion passed.
2. Chairperson Hawkins recognized Mr. Tom Day, Director of Legislative Administrative Services, who presented a proposed amendment to LCC Policy 38, Correspondence and Mailing, revising the newsletter printing allotment deadline from adjournment sine die of the legislature to May 31. House Majority Leader Chris Croft moved to amend LCC Policy 38 as proposed. House Minority Leader Brandon Woodard seconded the motion. The motion passed.
3. Chairperson Hawkins stated that the LCC Subcommittee on Administration had received and reviewed applications for the Legislative Chief Information Technology Officer (CITO) and conducted interviews thereof. Chairperson Hawkins asked for members of the subcommittee for a recommendation for the LCC. Vice Chairperson Masterson, Senate Minority Leader Dinah Sykes and Chairperson Hawkins recommended Altaf Uddin to be put forth to the LCC for consideration. Vice Chairperson Masterson moved that the LCC Subcommittee on Administration recommend Altaf Uddin be submitted as the recommendation of the subcommittee as Legislative CITO. Senate Minority Leader Sykes seconded the motion. The motion passed. Vice Chairperson Masterson moved to adopt the recommendation of the subcommittee and appoint Altaf Uddin as Legislative CITO and authorize the chairperson and Mr. Day to prepare, negotiate and finalize employment arrangements, including compensation. Senate Minority Leader Sykes seconded the motion. The motion passed.
4. Chairperson Hawkins recognized Mr. Day to give an update on the KLISS Modernization Project. Mr. Day stated that two stop work orders were issued and Propylon has been

instructed not to perform billable work other than the delivery of the most recent contracted build. The KLISS Modernization Steering Committee is exploring all options for modernization of the KLISS system. Legislative IT has completed several changes to the current bill drafting system and the staff of the Office of Revisor of Statutes is testing such changes prior to the commencement of the 2026 Legislative Session.

5. Chairperson Hawkins recognized Mr. Day to provide an update on the Constituent Relationship Software Service agreement with Indigov. Mr. Day stated that the contract amount to be paid to Indigov increases in the second year of the contract. Pursuant to LCC direction, Mr. Day negotiated a reduction in the amount to be paid to Indigov in the second year to be equal to the amount paid in the first year with the option to purchase additional licenses above the 150 licenses allocated in year one. President Masterson has signed, as chairperson of LCC, the new arrangement for year two. Chairperson Hawkins stated that the LCC will review the contract arrangement at the September LCC meeting to determine the course for year three of the contract.
6. Chairperson Hawkins stated that there is an opportunity for consultation with a former university president on the higher education funding budget. Vice Chairperson Masterson moved that the LCC employ a contract consultant pursuant to K.S.A. 46-1204 to provide professional services related to higher education budget and authorized the LCC Chairperson to review and sign any associated agreement or contract. House Majority Leader Croft seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Upon completion of all business before the LCC, the meeting was adjourned.
